**This month I have decided to run the important message from the board in my column. It is about the most talked about subject there is, which of course is music. I want to add that we have worked really hard to try and come up with what we feel is the right mix of music for our club and more importantly we do plan on seeing that it is played as well as trying to protect the music that this club was founded on.**

## **IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD**

**Music has always been a topic of discussion for many, many years and may continue to be, however, at our meeting in September the board reviewed the DJ guidelines. While the guidelines have been part of the DJ contract for many, many years, the board really did not do a very good job of enforcing and explaining them; and the DJs while trying at times to follow them, many times did not adhere to them either. This is going to change effective November 1st. From now on the guidelines will be enforced and the DJs will be required to follow them if they want to play for this club. Guest DJs are exempt from the regular guidelines; however, they are given guidelines, just not as restrictive. This club is made up mostly of people from their late 50s into their 70s. It has been brought to our attention numerous times that while people like to hear some new music and some different music; they would like to hear more of the music that they know. Latin clubs have their music, country western clubs have their music and the Jitterbug club has our music – it needs to be played. We try very hard to provide a good mix of music, and will continue to do that, but it will not be at the expense of the music from the 50s and 60s.**

**The current guidelines are as follows: “At least 60% of the music should be recognizable as 50s and 60s remakes included. A maximum of 40% of the music should be from the Blues/Beach/Contemporary category and a minimum of two songs should be played from the following categories: Night Club 2 – West Coast – Hustle – Country 2-step – line dances – Waltz.”**

**For many, many years we have not been playing any where near the 60% of 50s and 60s music. After a lengthy discussion we have come up with what we feel is fair to everyone. Please keep in mind, we said fair that doesn't mean everyone will be happy with this, but this needs to be addressed and resolved.**

**Effective November 1st the guidelines will change to 50% of the music should be recognizable as 50s and 60s remakes included. The rest of the guidelines might be altered slightly but the for the most part will remain the same.**

**At the upcoming election on December 7th, there will be an addition to the by-laws to try and protect the 50s and 60s music; we strongly urge you to vote yes on this. What this means is that a board can no longer just come in and change the music entirely. While a board will still have leverage and can adjust 50% of the music, they cannot change the percentage or eliminate the music from the 50s and 60s on which this club was founded. In order to change the percentage of the music from the 50s and 60s it will now require a by-law change and that requires the membership to vote, not just a board. If the membership votes to**

**change, then so be it, but no board can come in and change the percentage played or do away with the 50s and 60s music.**

**We are aware that some will say it wasn't played when it was 60%, what makes me think it will be played now at 50%. First of all, (providing it is voted in), it will be in the by-laws, which makes it so much easier to enforce. Second, the board will do their job and see that it is, third, the DJs have been informed of all of this in our October 19th meeting so they are fully aware of the change. Are they going to be fired if one night they play 49%, of course not. The important thing here is that through the years we have drifted too far away from what we are about, that needs to stop now, otherwise we are going to forget what this club is. This is an older club with older people who at least half the time would like to hear more of the music that they know; it is our goal to provide that.**

**CWCJC Board of Directors**

**Sweet Home Chicago 2013 was a loss of \$274. As I stated in one of my earlier columns our count was down almost a fourth of what it was the previous year, with the majority of that being out of town people who did not purchase a ticket this year. All in all, while we wish it wasn't a loss, things could have been much worse. Thanks to the generosity of a fellow club member who truly cares about our club and wants to make sure it remains successful; we received a check to cover this loss. This club member wishes to remain anonymous and so we shall honor that request, we wish to express our gratitude on behalf of the entire club.**

**Our 24th anniversary celebration is coming up on November 16th at Chevy Chase (flyer enclosed). This year we will be presenting the CWCJC appreciation award to Gloria Medel. Gloria is one of our dance instructors and she is also our web-master and resident flyer maker. Gloria has served on our board as Dance Director and has also served on the board of the American Bop Association of which she is a member of their Hall of Fame. Gloria has been active in the dance community for many, many years and continually works for our club as well. Plan on coming out to Chevy Chase on November 16th and see Gloria receive this well-deserved award and celebrate 24 years of our club.**

**Now for my little election blurb: The President's position is up for election on December 7th. I feel that I still can contribute and I enjoy working for the club, so I do plan on running again. I know that I cannot please everyone, but I am very hopeful that the majority of our members are happy with the way the club is being run. I want to thank the board and all the members who have been so supportive and helpful throughout the years.**

## **OPEN BOARD MEETING SUMMARY**

The following items from the open board meeting on August 3rd, were discussed at our meeting in September, below is the outcome of that discussion. Some questions have been put together.

**Question:** if the 50/50 pot is over \$200 could we split that so more people would have a chance to win?

**Answer:** We need to tell people up front before the raffle tickets are sold that we are going to do this, otherwise, they assume that there is only going to be one winner. While this is something we could consider for Chevy Chase or Sweet Home Chicago, where the pots are usually over \$200, this really would not be practical to do at one of our regular dances because the pots are rarely over \$200.

**Question:** Could we have a dance every week and could we have more dance lessons prior to the dances? What about lessons at North Park Center?

**Answer:** Unfortunately, it is too costly (\$750 per dance), to have a dance each week. The club has actually taken a loss on 7 dances in a row (partly due to summer). We will consider scheduling more dance lessons prior to the dance, but again there are costs involved with this (\$ to the Legion, DJ and instructors in addition to the regular fees). We have a sign up sheet planned to see how many people would be interested in lessons at North Park.

**Comment:** Some songs are just too long; perhaps the DJs could fade them out.

**Answer:** We had a meeting with our DJs in October, and have asked them to please try and keep the songs to 3 minutes or there about, otherwise fade it out.

**Question:** Who decides on the music that is being played? Would like to hear more of the music that we grew up with and recognize. Member said that this is one of the reasons they joined the club. Also, in the past other members have signed a note asking for this.

**Answer:** the DJs are given guidelines to follow, however, that night they may want to try something a little different to see how it goes. Please see the important message from the board about music in the President's column.

**Question:** Can we have a live band for our 25th?

**Answer:** They would have to be reasonable and play music that we can dance to. We are open to suggestions from the members.

**Question:** Is the board planning more advertising for our Chevy Chase dances and Sweet Home Chicago to hopefully attract more people so these events don't go away? Also, how about a theme dance for Chevy Chase?

**Answer:** As long as we come close financially, we will continue having these events, and we are looking into advertising more. We have had a few theme dances at Chevy Chase, but it doesn't seem to increase the attendance. We will take this under consideration again.

**Questions:** Could we have a late breakfast or lighter dinner at Chevy Chase?

**Answer:** We have checked with Chevy Chase and they will not do a late night breakfast and the cost of a lighter buffet is \$2 less per person than our current buffet. We feel it is not worth the money to change from the bigger buffet which the majority of the people seem to like .

**Question:** Why is the membership dropping? Could we call or write to the members asking why they didn't renew?

**Answer:** Membership drops for a variety of reasons, people are getting older, some are ill others have passed away, the economy, other clubs; people may want to do other things. We are not totally comfortable calling, however we are considering a short survey that we could mail to them.

**Question: Could we put on a demonstration at the new Fashion Outlet in Rosemont to show what our club is about in hopes to attract new members?**

**Answer: What many people may not realize is that you have to pay for parking, this may deter many of our members from coming out. Keeping in mind that we would have to pay the DJ this may not be very cost effective to try.**

**Statement: We need to try and get younger people to come to the club.**

**Answer: Most younger people do not want to dance to our music, nor do most of them want to be in a club that is comprised of older people, they want their own club. We feel at this time that things would change a lot and divide the club, most members want the club that we have now and not have to morph into something just to keep going. Right now we are doing okay, granted the membership has declined, but we still get new members joining. There is no reason to think that older people cannot keep a club going at least for the foreseeable future.**

**Comment: Would like to see a questionnaire at the front table so that people could say what they liked or didn't like about the club.**

**Answer: We already have a suggestion box up there that both members and non-members use.**

**Suggestion: for Sweet Home Chicago 2014, post the amount of the 50/50 so that people can see how large the pot is growing during the night. When people see how big the pot is they may be more likely to purchase a ticket or buy more tickets.**

**Answer: We actually did this in 2012, but not in 2013. We will bring this back for 2014.**

## **BY-LAW CHANGE ON THE DECEMBER 7th BALLOT**

**This addition to the by-laws is to protect the music that this club was founded on, and to see that it is played at our regular dances**

**The bold print is an addition to this section. All else remains the same.**

**SECTION 3. PURPOSES: Chicago's Windy City Jitterbug Club is a not for profit, non-charitable corporation established to provide growth and the perpetuation of jitterbug dancing, i.e. the true expression of American Vitality.**

***CWCJC is also dedicated as well to the preservation of the music from the 50s and 60s on which this club was founded. 50% of the music played at our regular dances must be from this era. The purposes of CWCJC are to provide a bond among its jitterbug dancers so they can travel and meet other enthusiasts of dancing, to promote and exchange steps and styling among jitterbug dancers throughout the country, and to spread and develop jitterbug dancing so that more people will be able to enjoy and appreciate it. This change to the by-laws is to eliminate the sales director position and replace it with a technical director position. We no longer sell club merchandise on any regular basis other than jackets and shoe bags. Our club shirts are sold through Embroidery on Demand. We are in need of a technical director to handle constant contact, our club's email, advertising and our face book page.***

**SECTION 12. SALES DIRECTOR – eliminate this position and create TECHNICAL DIRECTOR in its place.**

**The technical director shall have the responsibility of maintaining the club's email list. Other responsibilities include sending out email messages (constant contact) prior to each dance. Advertising special events such as Chevy Chase and Sweet Home Chicago as well as other events that may arise. Checking and answering questions sent to the club's email site, maintaining the club's face book page and assisting as needed in club advertising. The technical director is also the back-up person for our club's web-master. He/she shall perform other duties as from time to time that may be assigned to him/her by the President or Board of Directors.**

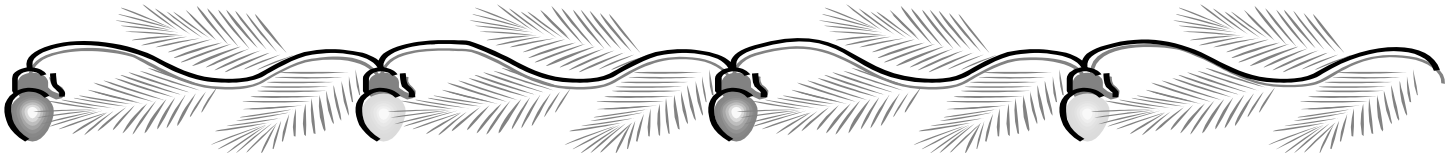
